The Civic Stewardship Award

The Civic Stewardship Award is an Award of Merit to an individual or organization that has made a significant contribution to the built environment of the St. Louis region and to further the goals and objectives of the St. Louis Chapter of the A.S.L.A.

The qualifications for the award include the following:

1: One (1) page letter 8 ½"x11" describing the merits of the individual or organization.

2: Optional: brochures, photographs, graphics, files, etc....which illustrate the merits of the individual or organization.

The Robert Goetz Award

The Robert Goetz Award for Distinguished Career in Landscape Architecture acknowledges the career of a local landscape architect who has practiced the profession with integrity, recognition, and excellence. The award is not an annual award but rather will be awarded to worthy candidates as determined by the qualifications submittals and the discretion of the Executive Committee.

The award is named for Robert Goetz, FASLA founder and principal of Robert E. Goetz and Associates. Mr. Goetz has enjoyed a distinguished career in landscape architecture in the Saint Louis region for over 40 years. He has also been an ardent promoter of the profession. In 1992 he was elected a Fellow by the American Society of Landscape Architects.

The qualifications for the award include:

1: Practice of landscape architecture in private or public sector for a minimum of twenty five years.

2: Licensed landscape architect in Missouri or other state. Licensure must be in good standing with the state and void of claims and/or violations of state ordinances regarding the practice of landscape architecture.

3: Member of the American Society of Landscape Architects

4: Significant service in promoting the profession through teaching, volunteer efforts, and service as a member or officer in the St. Louis Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects.

5: Nomination letters from a minimum of five references.
