The Civic Stewardship Award

The Civic Stewardship Award is a pro-active award by the St. Louis Chapter to recognize an individual or organization that have raised awareness or shown stewardship of the natural or built environment. The recipient may or may not be a landscape architect.

The qualifications for the award include:

1. Up to a one (1) 8 ½" x 11" page letter describing the merits of the individual or organization. This is a pro-active award giving by the St. Louis Chapter Ex-Comm, detailed or elaborate submittals are not necessary.
2. Optional: brochures, photographs, graphics, files, etc...which illustrate the merits of the individual or organization.

The Robert Goetz Award

The Robert Goetz Award for Distinguished Career in Landscape Architecture acknowledges the career of a local landscape architect who has practiced the profession with integrity, recognition and excellence. The award is not an annual award, but rather will be awarded to worthy candidates as determined by the qualification submittals and by the discretion of the Executive Committee.

The qualifications for the award include:

1. Practice of landscape architecture in private or public sector for a minimum of twenty-five (25) years.
2. Licensed landscape architect in Missouri or other states. Licensure must be in good standing with the state and void of claims and/or violations of state ordinances regarding the practice of landscape architecture.
3. Member of the American Society of Landscape Architects
4. Significant service in promoting the profession through teaching, volunteer efforts, and as a member or officer in the St. Louis ASLA Chapter.
5. Nomination letters from a minimum of five (5) references.
